Sometimes the simplest tools can have the biggest impact. Our new WashPod stencil sets allow clients to step into a layout and truly feel the space. Each of our site survey teams now carries a stencil corresponding to each WashPod model, which can be laid out on the ground - even in a garden if needed - to help clients experience the space before installation.

This was incredibly helpful recently for Ian, a wheelchair user in Leeds. By trying out the Internal Compact WashPod stencil, Ian could assess turning circles and orientation ahead of the installation. His OT, Sarah Ellis, commented:

"The stencil has allowed us all to get a real feel for the space needed. It also helped us explore different orientations to avoid blocking kitchen light. It was really useful to work with."

CHRISTINE'S STORY

Christine, who has Motor Neurone Disease, shared her experience: "The fact that a WashPod can be re-used by councils feels like a gold standard approach worth wider publicity."

Like many in similar situations, Christine faced a short timeline and limited options. With a mortgage, unsuitable home, and delays in planning approvals, a property conversion was simply unfeasible.

Thanks to a reusable WashPod funded through disability grants, she avoided costly renovations and can now focus on creating a comfortable downstairs living space—without the stress of a full conversion.

"It's hard to quantify how valuable that peace of mind is," she added.

A devastating fall at the Defender Bramham Horse Trials left 23-year-old international event rider Saffron Cresswell paralysed from the waist down. After months of hospital rehabilitation, she was only able to return home thanks to a WashPod funded by the British Eventing Support Trust.

"I would still be in hospital if I hadn't been able to wash myself at home. The WashPod gave me a head start on independence."

WashPod Featured in ADASS Report





The Turnaround Service in Action

We have seen some great examples of our unique Turnaround Service at work for Local Authorities such as the rapid, re-use of an Internal Compact WashPod that was installed into a new property.

Originally, we installed this WashPod early in 2024 and removed when it was no longer needed, both in just a few hours. The Council had bought the WashPod with a DFG as 'specialised equipment' allowing them to retain ownership as the Housing Renewal Grants (Additional Conditions) General Consent 1996 entitles authorities to reclaim specialist equipment.
